

Twice Around Treasures at the Quilt Show

It is that time again when we begin the frenzy of activities for the upcoming show. It has been longer than usual since the last show. Twice Around Treasures is a large part of profits from the show and a

"first stop" for many of our devoted attendees.

So we would like to take this opportunity to alert you of some changes, and remind you of the guidelines set forth to make this an efficient, profitable, and fun experience for those donating, preparing, and purchasing treasures donated by our generous members. There is an indescribable thrill sharing our passion with others, whether they are newbies or veterans of the art of quilting.

Acceptable items:

- 100% cotton fabric
- · Quilting notions such as rulers

Based on recorded experiences of past chair ladies, please do not donate:

- Poly blend, upholstery, or apparel fabric
- Magazines
- Sewing machines
- Quilt frames
- Craft supplies (one would think that this would be a great outlet and source for crazy quilt supplies, but historic sales have disproved this theory). We have found that buttons are an exception to the rule.
- Books more than 15 years old (this seems like a short time, however the internet, web sites, Pinterest), in addition to the technologies of quilting tools and accessories, has had a tremendous impact on how and what we quilt). Newer books will be accepted after 4 p.m. during the Wednesday setup.

Please note that once an item is donated it is out of your control. Items donated outside of the established guidelines will be re-donated/dispersed at the discretion of the TAT committee.

2022 Challenge Quilt Reminder

Guidelines for our 2022 challenge quilt were given out September 2021. A reminder was given at February business meeting. Complete rules are posted on the TRQG website under the "forms" section.

Only two people admitted to have started theirs. Remember, four ribbons will be awarded this category at the quilt show. After Sally Rowe's presentation at our February meeting (photo below), members should be inspired to make a small memory quilt!



Highlights of 2022 Challenge Quilt Rules

For complete rules, go to the "Forms" section on the TRQG website.

Theme: Memories...Connected by Thread. Create a quilt connected to one of your memories.

Size: Outside dimensions a minimum of 100 inches total and a maximum of 144 inches. No tote bags, vests, etc.

Construction: You may use any method to construct your quilt – piecing, paper piecing, applique, etc. All entries must be quilted and completely finished.

Embellishments: Each quilt must contain at least three types of embellishment.

Colors: The front of the quilt must include three colors determined by your initials. These do not have to be the dominant colors, but you will be asked to identify what your colors are and where they are used in your project. We encourage "creative license" in identifying your "initial" colors!
