# NEW! Beginning Quilting Class

### May 22: Attic Window Supplies

- A panel that would look good if looking at it through a window (prefer 24" x 40")
- 3 fabrics for the sashing that coordinate in 3 shades of the same color. i.e. light, medium and dark gray solid or solid-ish. Black always looks good for the dark color, then just be sure you have a good contrast for the light and medium.
- 1 ½ yards light fabric (outer border)
- ½ yard medium fabric
- ¾ yard dark fabric (inner border)
- ¾ yard binding
- If your panel is larger than 24 x 40 please bring more of sashing and border fabrics.
- Sewing machine, rotary cutter, rulers, notions

# Community Sewing for April, May and June (some date changes from last newsletter)

The next Community Sewing day is April 24. We will be making sewand-flip scrappy strip blocks. Bring your scrap strips and either foundation paper you can remove OR light-weight fabric that stays in the quilt (I like to use light-weight muslin.) Extra paper will be available.

On May 15 we will be doing quilt-as-you-go scrappy strip blocks. You will need four 10-inch batting squares (use all the same batting content) and a variety of fabric strips.

On June 19, we will be making pillowcases from Christmas fabric to donate to retirement centers this coming Christmas. You will need Christmas fabric in one-yard pieces.

#### **Block of the Month**


