Spring Retreat...Oh My!

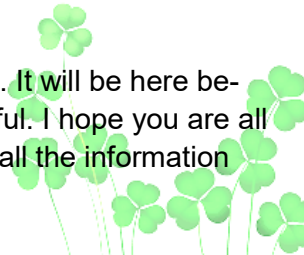

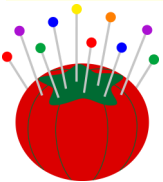

## Program News from the Vice President

Spring is on the way! Flowers are blooming, the grass is turning green and there is a lot happening at Twin Rivers Quilters Guild.

### **MARCH 26: QUILTING WITH RULERS**

**(DOMESTIC RULERWORK) CLASS:** There is still time to sign up for this class. Please email me at [Lmanette59@gmail.com](mailto:Lmanette59@gmail.com) if you are interested. It is on March 26 at the Marriott Springhill Suites at 300 Hotel Dr. This is the hotel next to Sake. The class will be held from 10:00-4:00. There will be a half-hour break for lunch, **so you will need to bring a bag lunch.** The cost of the class is \$30 and you will also need to purchase a ruler from Loving Stitches for an additional \$30. This is to be given to Loving Stitches at the time of the class.

#### **You will also need the following:**

- Sewing machine in good working order with slide-on table, power cord, foot pedal, machine manual
- A ruler foot attachment for your machine
- Thread – 40wt cotton
- Quilt sandwich – (top fabric, batting, backing) all measuring 23" square; light colored fabrics, preferably solid or tone on tone
- Needles – topstitch or jeans needles 90/14
- Every Angle by Amanda Murphy (Bernina – high shank 6mm (1/4") ruler); low shank available with special order
- #72 or #72s ruler foot from Bernina, or ruler foot for non-Bernina owners
- Marking pens – 5-6 different colors
- Snips
- You will want to bring an extra light for your workspace

### **APRIL 9: GUEST SPEAKER AND WORKSHOP:**

**Roxanne Lesser** from Raleigh will be our guest speaker at the April 9 Business Meeting. Roxanne is a textile artist who started quilting in 1998. In 2004 her focus turned to "art quilting." She considers fabric, paint and thread to be her tools and even dyes her own fabric. She will be giving a lecture entitled,

#### **USING SHINY, FLUFFY, SHEER & WEIRD MATERIALS IN YOUR ART QUILTS.**

### **On Friday, April 10, Roxanne will give a workshop:**

## Supplies to Bring for PHOTO-PATTERN-QUILT Class

### Basic Sewing Supplies:

- Sewing machine in good working order with darning/free motion foot and assortment of needle sizes.
- Good range colors of cotton or polyester threads
- Neutral bobbin thread 50-60 wt.
- Rotary cutter, small mat
- Small sharp scissors, pins

### Pattern Making Supplies:

- Freezer Paper
- 1 Teflon sheet or parchment paper
- 1 package of white Misty Fuse fusible web or Wonder Under
- Ball point pen, pencil
- Fat black Sharpie marker

### Fabrics:

- ½ yard of cheap thin muslin

For your artwork fabric, use various batiks or small prints or hand dyed fabric based on the photo you will be doing.

- **Hibiscus:** red/orange 1/8 yd and fat quarter of greenish background
- **Seascape:** blue for sky, deeper blue for water, small yellow for sun, pale pink scraps, dark grey for foreground
- **Cityscape:** brilliant orange for sky, yellow for sun, dark brown/black
- Piece of batting, ¼ yd is plenty
- Backing fabric

Roxanne will have additional patterns available for purchase for \$5.

Besides tea, we will serve tea sandwiches, desserts, fruit and cheese. We also have a free raffle during the afternoon, and several other surprises!

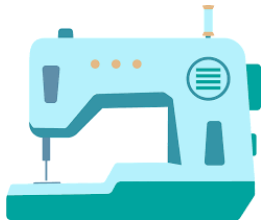

**Military Quilts**

Thank you Kay Amend for the donation of military quilts. They will be appreciated by our service members and local veterans.

**Remember that stretcher quilts should be 40 inches by 60 inches for donation to the USO in Europe.** They are used to comfort and keep warm injured or ill military members who are transported home by aircraft on stretchers or gurneys. The quilt size requirement prevents the quilts tangling in medical apparatus.

Quilts of other sizes will be distributed to local veterans groups or nursing facilities where veterans are residing.

## **An Invitation from Rolayne Schwendy: Textiles at Oriental History Museum**

Our Oriental History Museum on the main street has a new exhibit up, STITCHES IN TIME, through May 30. We have samples of most every kind of needlework- hucking, embroidery, counted cross stitch, tating, knitting, crochet, and of course quilting. There is a large display of sewing boxes, birds, a chatelaine, old notions, silver thimbles and needle holders. Old and newer quilts, some for sale, hanky baby bonnets, a Singer Featherweight and a hand-crank Davis sewing machine. A family quilt of mine is on display, Bertha Hill completed it at age 15 after the Civil War, and died the next year of diphtheria. It was hung in one of our quilt shows featuring antique quilts about 12 years ago.

**Hours are 11:00-3:00 on Fridays and 1:00-4:00 on Saturdays. There are many nice places to consume nutrients in Oriental as well!**

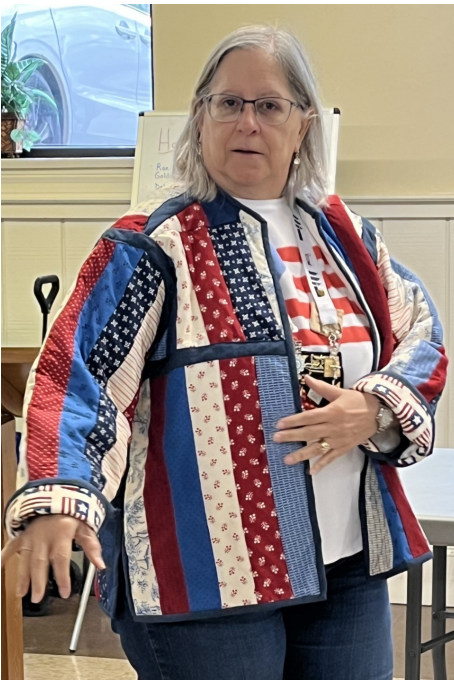
